All Documents necessary for entry to the show (except health cert.) must be uploaded to fox village at time of initial registration or emailed to Teresa Uddo (tuddo66@gmail.com) or be subject to incomplete entry fee if not received by Oct. 3.

Health Requirements: By Texas law, each horse entering the state of Texas must have a **CURRENT 21-day HEALTH CERTIFICATE**, issued by a licensed veterinarian. Any horse entering the grounds must be **accompanied by a negative Coggins**, issued within the last twelve months for all horses. Any horses showing illness will be asked to leave the show grounds.

Directions: Take Hwy 249 to Decker Prairie, and head west on Decker Prairie. Turn left at stop sign and follow Decker Prairie-Rosehill Road past Peden Road to side entrance of the facility.

We will be awarding year end circuit awards to those with the most points accumulated by division based on ribbons earned throughout the 4 shows scheduled for the year! This show followed by March 28-29, June 13-14, and October 24-25 shows will all provide opportunity to be in the rankings. Classical and Western points will be separated. The fee for the series is \$35 and will be put toward the year end ribbons and trophies. We look forward to seeing YOU!!

Rules and Regulations

All participants MUST have signed releases.

ALL riders must wear helmets while mounted

Entries:

Entries received after the closing date will be subject to a \$35.00 late fee per entry. All entries must be submitted online at <https://entry.foxvillage.com>.

A horse may only be entered under the legal name of the owner. Each horse/rider must be entered on a separate entry form. In addition to entries of persons suspended or expelled from US Equestrian Federation, a Recognized competition may refuse any entry of an exhibitor or the participation of an agent, trainer, rider, or handler who has shown an objectionable attitude towards a Recognized competition or previous unsportsmanlike behavior at a Recognized competition or its management. NSF and returned checks will be charged a \$50 fee.

Non-competing Horses:

Non-competing horses are welcome on a space available basis. They must have an entry form with signed releases, current coggins, health certificate and pay non- compete/schooling fee, office fee per show, and stall fee. Non-Competing horses must wear a number when out of stall.

Classes:

Classes will be run and adjudicated based on the current USEF/WDAA Rulebook. All decisions made by the Judge and/or Show Management are final and cannot be protested. Show Management reserves the right to ask any exhibitor to leave the show grounds for any reason including but not limited to unsportsmanlike conduct and animal cruelty.

Stalling Information:

The stalls are 10X10 with crushed granite floors. Tack stalls are available. No stalls may be used without payment of appropriate fees. Stalls will be considered reserved only when an entry form and appropriate monies are received.

Wash racks are available.

Ride Times:

Ride times will be emailed to the exhibitors prior to the show and will be posted on the software.

Awards:

Ribbons will be awarded 1st through 6th place. Judging, class specifications and conduct shall be in accordance with the current USEF/WDAA Rulebook. All decisions made by the Judge and/or Show Management are deemed final and cannot be protested. Overall highpoint Champion and Reserve Champion awarded to horse and rider combination with the highest score for Jr/Yr, AA, & Open excluding Freestyles

Year End Circuit Awards: 1st = 10 points, 2nd = 6 points, 3rd = 4 points, 4th = 2 points, 5th = 1 point, 6th = .5 point. High Point = 10 points, Reserve High Point = 5 points.

Arenas/Footing/Warm-up:

We have two covered arenas and one outdoor ring. All arenas have state of the art, European footing with a permanent irrigation system. We have two lunging arenas with the same footing, and our Field Arena has multi-layered base with grass.

Children/Pets:

We welcome well-mannered dogs on leashes; however, loose dogs will be impounded and will incur a \$100.00 fee which is donated to the local humane society. Children must be adult supervised at all times and remain courteous. Unruly dogs or children will be asked to leave the show area for the protection of exhibitors.

Hazardous Weather/Act of God/Accident Policy:

Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, accident, or emergency.

Every effort will be made to reschedule with priority given to any qualifying classes being offered. No refunds for cancellations/rescheduling due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, accidents, or emergencies.

Cruelty or Abuse:

Cruelty or abuse of horses is strictly forbidden on the show grounds. Submitting a signed entry constitutes acceptance of this provision.

Discipline:

Any act of dishonesty, discourtesy or disobedience to horse show officials on the part of the owner, trainer, or rider will disqualify the horse and exhibitor from adjudication. The show management reserves the right to remove such a person or persons from the show without being liable for compensation or damages.

Entry Refunds:

Prior to the closing date, withdrawals accompanied by a Veterinarian's Certification of Inability to show will receive a refund of all fees except office fees. After the closing date only stall fees will be refunded. No refunds after the start of the show. Affirmation of the United States Equestrian Federation Helmet/Vest Rule: GR801.4 Dress. Any exhibitor must wear protective headgear (ASTM/SEI) and/or a protective safety vest, specifically designed for use in equestrian sport in any division or class without penalty from the judge. The Federation recommends that the vest meet or surpass the current ASTM standard or be certified by the Safety Equipment Institute. Helmets are strongly encouraged during all schooling and required when showing. Juniors are required to wear helmets at all times. Western hats may be worn for Western dressage.

ATTENTION COMPETITORS: Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with the correct association numbers (WDAA) for the horse, owner, rider, and trainer, before the day of the competition. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be eligible to be entered toward regional or national awards.

SAFE SPORT STATEMENT:

All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies.

More information about this can be found at www.usef.org. Any person suspended or banned by the US Center for SafeSport is not allowed to be on competition grounds. If anyone reports the presence of any suspended or banned person, management must take action to remove them from the grounds.

Warning: Under Texas Law (Chapter 87, Civil Practices and Remedies Code), a livestock show sponsor or farm animal activity sponsor is not liable for an injury to or the death of a participant in livestock shows resulting from the inherent risks of livestock show activities.

All rules are in effect and will be enforced from the time a competitor arrives on the show grounds. All participants are responsible for knowing USEF rules and updates.

WDAA Membership Statement

To be eligible to participate and/or compete as an exhibitor, owner, lessee, agent, coach, or trainer in any Western Dressage class or at any Federation Western Dressage Licensed Competition persons must be active members of WDAA or pay a non-member fee equal to the price of an annual membership for each competition. Exception: WDAA membership or non-member fee is not required at a Lite Licensed competition. Lessees are considered owners in connection with this membership requirement. In the event of an entry under multiple ownership, only one owner need be a Member or pay a non-member fee. The competition is responsible for listing either the active member or the owner that paid the non-member fee in the results. The competitions will be responsible for forwarding a list of the names of individuals who pay non-member fees at the competition to WDAA with the post competition report. Payment of non-member fees for the purpose of competing does not entitle the individual to any privileges of the WDAA membership.

How to Join WDAA

WDAA membership applications are available on the WDAA website:

<https://www.westerndressageassociation.org/>. Adult memberships (18 years and over): \$55; Junior memberships (under 18 as of December 1, 2025): \$40. WDAA memberships run January – December.

If you do not provide proof of amateur status, you will be placed in the open division. Because this is a USEF recognized show, the only acceptable proof of amateur status is a USEF Amateur card or EC Amateur card. Please see <http://www.usef.org> for more information on obtaining an amateur card. GR 1306 and GR 1307.

Sharps Containers:

Competition management shall place a minimum of one sharps container per each competition whether or not stabling is provided. Additionally, at least one sharps container per fifty occupied stalls for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments in convenient locations in barns housing competition horses. It is competition management's responsibility to replace such containers when full and dispose of them properly. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitor or their agents, up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments. Competition management will place a notice of this requirement either in its prize list or on a specific handout given to trainers on check in at the competition. If local law has different requirements, local law will prevail. GR 1210.4

Equine Vaccination Rule:

At federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration by or under the direction of a veterinarian. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations, name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody and control of the horse, name serial number and expiration date of the vaccine and date of vaccine administration. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward or technical delegate when requested. Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee.

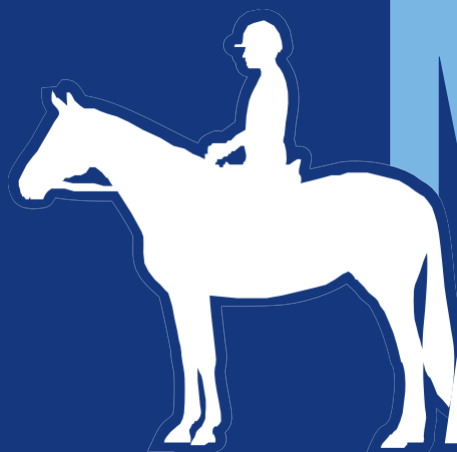
Motorized Vehicle Statement:

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above-described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulteur or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of _____(Competition). I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

If not currently a USEF Active Competing member or Subscriber, I acknowledge that I will be enrolled for no cost as a USEF Fan and my USEF Fan Account will continue to annually automatically renew in USEF's sole discretion. Additionally, I acknowledge that the benefits of a USEF Fan are subject to change without notice. USEF may in its sole discretion, at any time, terminate my USEF Fan status. I acknowledge that I may opt out at any time by going to My USEF Dashboard or calling (859) 810-8733.

WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and _____ ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

WARNING:

UNDER TEXAS LAW (CHAPTER 87, CIVIL PRACTICE AND REMEDIES CODE), A FARM ANIMAL PROFESSIONAL IS NOT LIABLE FOR AN INJURY TO OR THE DEATH OF A PARTICIPANT IN FARM ANIMAL ACTIVITIES RESULTING FROM THE INHERENT RISKS OF FARM ANIMAL ACTIVITIES.

C. ASSUMPTION OF RISK: I understand that the aforementioned Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the USEF Events, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties defined below, and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any USEF Events. I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my employees or contractors under my direction and control at any USEF Event.

D. WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNITY: In conjunction with my participation in any USEF Event, I hereby release, waive and covenant not to sue, and further agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the following parties: USEF, USEF Recognized Affiliate Associations, the United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee (USOPC), USEF clubs, members, Event participants (including athletes/riders, coaches, trainers, judges/officials, and other personnel), the Event owner, licensee, and competition managers; the promoters, sponsors, or advertisers of any USEF Event; any charity or other beneficiary which may benefit from the USEF Event; the owners, managers, or lessors of any facilities or premises where a USEF Event may be held; and all directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, and volunteers of any of the aforementioned parties (**Individually and Collectively, the "Released Parties" or "Event Organizers"**), with respect to any liability, claim(s), demand(s), cause(s) of action, damage(s), loss, or expense (including court costs and reasonable attorney fees) of any kind or nature ("**Liability**") which may arise out of, result from, or relate in any way to my participation in the USEF Events, including claims for Liability caused in whole or in part by the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties.

E. COMPLETE AGREEMENT AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSE: This Agreement represents the complete understanding between the parties regarding these issues and no oral representations, statements or inducements have been made apart from this Agreement. If any provision of this Agreement is held to be unlawful, void, or for any reason unenforceable, then that provision shall be deemed severable from this Agreement and shall not affect the validity and enforceability of any remaining provisions.

I HAVE CAREFULLY READ THIS DOCUMENT IN ITS ENTIRETY, UNDERSTAND ALL OF ITS TERMS AND CONDITIONS, AND KNOW IT CONTAINS AN ASSUMPTION OF RISK, RELEASE AND WAIVER FROM LIABILITY, AS WELL AS A HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNIFICATION OBLIGATIONS.

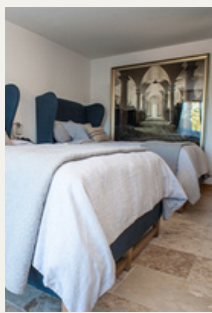

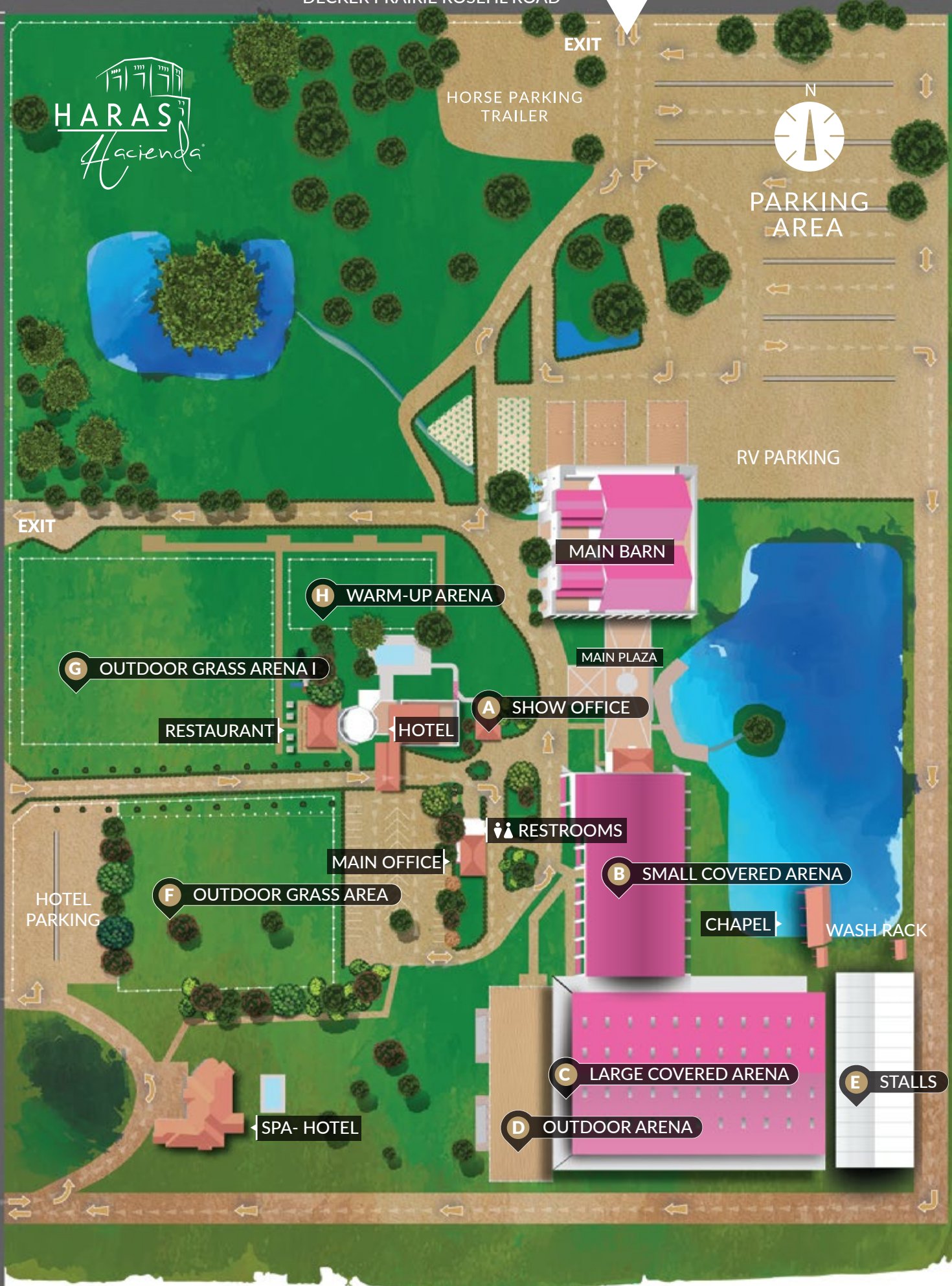
